

Shaping public construction

Work experience leads to a permanent position whilst helping to engage with and inspire construction's next generation

One of the great benefits of work experience is that it brings with it the opportunity to secure something permanent, whilst gaining valuable training and experience too. It provides the participant with the chance to gain insights

into the workings of a busy site and the employer with an opportunity to monitor and assess a candidate's performance throughout the placement.

This was certainly the case for James Grant, an SCF work placement candidate. He secured a placement with Morgan Sindall when he met them at a Jobs and Careers Fair set up by Saints Foundation. Morgan Sindall supports opportunities for local people in the areas they deliver projects and regularly attend events to showcase opportunities. They have worked with Saints FC for a number of years and understand the importance to local young people of developing close links with them. James joined the SCF Solent University new sport centre scheme in Southampton which is being delivered by Morgan Sindall.

James was out of work for a period of time when he saw a poster at a local job centre for 'workforce' at Saints Foundation. James attended the course where he learnt about money management and became involved in a local community centre project in Swaythling. This gave him a further interest in pursuing a career in construction. James had gained some work experience on-site a few years previously, but it had not worked out for him. Morgan Sindall met James at the career and jobs fair held by Saints Foundation and James successfully secured work experience via Morgan Sindall's supply chain (GP Masonry) on the SCF Solent University Sports facility. This gave James the chance to gain his CSCS card for brickwork and, within those two weeks, he gained a greater understanding of how a building goes together. James felt welcomed by the site team and said that the friendly approach helped him enjoy his work experience. Whilst on site, he had first-hand experience of pointing, bricklaying and drilling.

"The charity does brilliant work and we've been delighted to collaborate with them to offer work experience placements. It's inspiring to see people thriving as a result of this programme and James Grant, a young person who secured a placement with us through the Saints Foundation on the Solent University development, has since been awarded a full-time position."
